District Six is ZOOMING and BLOOMING!!!!!

I hope you all are well. Over the last two months, the District Six Zone Directors met with leaders from their lodges via ZOOM. During that event, we asked how each lodge used the \$200 from the District. Many lodges responded that they purchased a ZOOM plan which allows hosting of longer meetings. Some are purchasing cards for birthdays, postcards to send and keep members updated, and items for drivebys as gifts. It was good to talk to other lodge leaders and support one another. One lodge leader attended three different sessions. Zone 8, Colorado, had 29 Leaders from every lodge in that Zone in attendance.

Additionally, District Six hosted a ZOOM meeting for the whole District with guests Ron Stubbings, International President Sons of Norway, Chris Pinkerton CEO, Connie O'Brien Director of Fraternal Development and Marketing, David Crabb Fraternal Engagement Manager, and Doris Kamstra Membership Manager. We had over 130 members register for the event. I have never hosted anything like this on ZOOM and I think it all went well. Presentations covered what is happening at Headquarters in all the departments fraternal, financial, and foundation.

We have faced lots of challenges since the pandemic started - it continued way beyond what any of us could have imagined. However, out of this, we have learned to adapt and change. Many lodges are using Zoom or other virtual methods to reach out to their members, provide social contact, and culture programs, while others are using good old telephone trees. Most lodges utilize newsletters and continued them through last summer. The information presented by Doris during the ZOOM meeting supports the readership of these newsletters as a valuable member benefit. The District Board, as well as the Recreation Center Board, have found that they have been able to get more done and be more on top of things by having virtual meetings. The District Board, as a result of not having face-to-face meetings, was able to pass those savings on to the District's lodges as a \$200 gift to each lodge. Also, the board has something up their sleeves to pass on to members who are delegates for the 2022 District Convention - more to come on that. We have been pushed to adapt and realize there was no way we could continue to do things the way we have before. Our District's lodges continue to bloom despite the challenges.

Many members have received their vaccinations, which should allow safer group meetings. Some of the restrictions are starting to lift. I anticipate that by fall, things will get to a new normal that will include face-to-face gatherings. I so look forward to seeing each of you in person. However, I will continue to reach out virtually through e-mails and cards to support our fraternal family.

- At least 1 Lodge Event photo published in the Viking Magazine
- Lodge and/or members participate in or support a local community event
- Sharing Scandinavian Resources/Information with Lodge members at least once every 3 months
- Ensure your Lodge Events are visible to your local community through Public Service Announcements, Listings in Calendars, any and all media outlets at least once every 12 months

The goal is to have every lodge receive an award!

NEW Virtual Culture Program AWARD: The "Olaf Award"

The Olaf award is designed to recognize members who have developed virtual culture programs that have been utilized by a lodge either by ZOOM or in an in-person meeting

New Procedure for Golden Member Recognition

Golden members are those who have been members of Sons of Norway for thirty years and who are age 65 or older. I just achieved that status, with both criteria being achieved about the same time. Well, a year apart is close, right? Some folks are golden, younger than others. Okay, I was 66 and golden – last year.

Lodges can order Golden Membership pins from Sherry Gorse at <u>fraternal@sofn.com</u> or 612-821-4643. The pins are no longer automatically sent to new Golden Members, but Golden Membership pins are still free of charge.

Lodge Presidents and other officers can now download, personalize, and print out the special certificates for members attaining Golden Membership Status. They can be found on the Sons of Norway website, <u>www.sofn.com</u>.

- Sign in with your username and password.
- Click on the Member Resource button on top of page.
- Click on Lodge Leadership.
- Click on Administrative Resources.
- Click on View Lodge Forms.
- Scroll down to Certificates and click on Golden Membership.
- You can add the member's name, lodge name and lodge number as well as the date.

Lodge officers can use the monthly Activity Report and membership lists to determine who will attain or who has attained Golden Membership. Golden Membership is awarded to members who are age 65 or older and have been members for 30 years or more.

• Sons of Norway Lodge Membership Activity Report

This report is generated at the beginning of every month. It is automatically emailed or mailed to all lodge Vice Presidents, Financial Secretaries and Membership Secretaries. These officers (along with the President and a few other officers) can also access PDFs of these reports through their profile page after signing on to <u>sofn.com</u>. When a lodge member reaches Golden status, they are listed under the heading **New Golden Members** on the next monthly report.

- Sons of Norway Lodge Membership Lists Lodge officers can download PDF or Excel versions of their membership lists from their profile page after signing on to <u>sofn.com</u>.
 - To see who might be nearing their 30th anniversary with Sons of Norway, sort the Excel list by members' effective dates. Then, check those members' birthdates to see if they will be 65 years or older on their anniversary date.
 - Similarly, you can also sort the Excel list by age to see who is turning 65 this year. You would then check to see if they have also hit the 30-year anniversary threshold, in which case they will be eligible for Golden Status this year.
 - o PDF lists sorted by effective date or age can be requested from Membership Services.

THE FIRST HUNDRED YEARS OF SAN FRANCISCO'S HENRIK IBSEN LODGE #7, SONS OF NORWAY

Part Three: After the Quake; Panama-Pacific International Exposition of 1915

In the years after the 1906 Earthquake and Fire, San Francisco needed skilled carpenters and construction workers to rebuild. Norwegians flocked to San Francisco for the abundant jobs, as well as the warm and sunny environment. After 1908, many of these norske immigrants became dues-paying members of Henrik Ibsen Lodge---enjoying the camaraderie of their



fellows, as well as the language, songs and foods of home. More importantly, they helped each other with sick benefits and food baskets, when Lodge members were ill or out of work.

One of the Lodge's first fraternal projects was its participation in the 1909 Portola Celebration, which celebrated the City's rapid recovery from the Earthquake, as well as California's Spanish history. The Lodge built a 60 foot Viking ship for the Celebration's "Industrial, Commercial and Fraternal" parade, and Lodge members "sailed" down Market Street on a horse-drawn float, wearing (perhaps historically inappropriate) winged and horned helmets.

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Fifth Anniversary Banquet, 1913, Henrik Ibsen Lodge, Veterans' Hall, SF

Civic boosters again wanted to show the rest of the world that San Francisco was "back in business," so in 1915, they decided to stage an even grander festival: The Panama Pacific International Exposition. Nearly all of San Francisco's civil and fraternal groups participated. Led by members named Stromsheim, Wahle, Hexberg, Holt and Moen, Henrik Ibsen Lodge helped build and staff the

event's Norway Pavilion, and created a men's uniformed drill team to celebrate the event. The Pavilion spotlighted not only

Norwegian products and industrial displays (the uses of



whale oil!), but also works of art by Munch, Christian Krogh and Harald Sohlberg.

Former President Teddy Roosevelt visited the Nor-

way Pavilion, and must have been impressed by the hand-carved Norwegian "dragestil" or dragon-style



furniture, built specifically for the Exposition.




