Greetings, fellow District Six Members,


Most of us joined Sons of Norway for the connections. We wanted to connect with others through our shared culture and to celebrate our heritage.

"As a way to introduce myself, I am retired and had a career as a Marine, law enforcement, and as an advisor with the State Department. I have served as Camp Director at the Language and Heritage Camp at Alta and served in most officer positions at Valhall Lodge 6 -025 over the years. I have also served in officer positions at the House of Norway in Balboa Park. I am currently Foundation Director at Valhall. My wife's family all emigrated from Norway to Wisconsin. I have a daughter who lives in Norway thanks to meeting her husband at a "Folk school" there.



"My children attended Language Camps and attended schools in Norway. They have lifelong friendships and memories from these experiences.

"I personally believe in the work of the Foundation and would like to promote its programs and encourage ways to change lives through education and philanthropy."

"I would like to thank Jim for providing his introductory biography and formally welcome James (Jim) Adams as our new District Six Foundation Director." - *Lis Barca*

And here is some additional information from Jim:

"Greetings to District Sixmembers. I have been a member of Sons of Norway for over 40 years and have served in all the lodge officer roles. In addition, I have been Director of two Language and Cultural Camps at Camp Alta.

"I have seen the good the Foundation does and I appreciate the transparency of the Foundation website. It shows who has donated funds and where the funds are going and to whom. I also like the fact that the staff is small at headquarters, which in turn holds down administrative costs so the money donated goes to those who need it. Donations to the Foundation are tax deductible and can be customized.

"Each year we count on lodge presidents and lodge Foundation Directors to plan the Together, We Are the Future" fundraiser beginning in September and also the celebration of Foundation Month in October. Last year we had 222 applicants for scholarships and 32 were awarded - it would be great to be able to award more. In 2023, there were 66 grant requests and 33 were granted. SCHOLARSHIPS! 2024 IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER!



Hello, as in <u>HELLO! - ATTENTION!</u> To high school seniors and current college students. It's time to start thinking about 2024! If you are a member of Sons of Norway or have a parent or grandparent who is a member, you can apply for a **scholarship** from the **Sons of Norway Foundation.** There are a variety of scholarships available for <u>college, trade schools</u>, and study abroad, from \$1,500 to \$20,000+.

Go to the Sons of Norway website at www.sofn.com and click on Foundation. Then click on Scholarships and read about each one and who is eligible to apply. When you find one or more for which you qualify, read the Overview, Who Can Apply, and View Guidelines. Now, think about what you have to do to apply . . . and here are a few suggestions:

- 1. Treat the application as if it is a job application. Be thorough in completing all requirements of the application. Make a list of all the application requirements and check them off when completed. Then, double check before submitting. If any requirement is not completed, your application will automatically be rejected.
- 2. Read and study the Criteria section of the application. In your essay, you are asked to address six (6) key points. Use specific, experiential examples when answering these key points, especially your connection to Sons of Norway.
- 3. How did you find out about the Sons of Norway Foundation scholarship and/or what do you know about the Sons of Norway Foundation? Show you did more research than just a Google search.
- 4. Emphasize your community or school volunteer work.

We are excited to bring these opportunities to you! We believe you have the potential to be an excellent candidate. The applications are due in several months and we hope – indeed **RECOMMEND**, you start now to create a compelling application.

Attention Lodge Presidents and Secretaries:

REPORTING HOURS FOR THE AMERICAN FRATERNAL ALLIANCE

The good news is that a new method of reporting volunteer hours will be in place for 2023 reporting. It will be easier. The FraternalsGive.org platform requires way more information than is needed for Sons of Norway to report to the American Fraternal Alliance (AFA) to maintain our IRS tax exempt status.

However, any lodges that have entered data on the FraternalsGive website to date will have to recreate or retrieve the data for year-end reporting on another platform.

From a Q&A: What if I have already entered hours to FraternalsGive?

If you have entered any 2023 data into FraternalsGive already, please go in as soon as possible to retrieve that information so you can include it on the Survey Monkey platform that will be sent out in 2024. Headquarters will not have access to the FraternalsGive data you may have already entered.

Information needed besides lodge name, lodge number, and state:

Number of Fraternal Events

Total Fraternal Member (volunteer) Hours, event and individual Number of Community Service Events

Total Community Service Hours, event and individual

The new Survey Monkey platform is a work in progress. It may also require Community Service Financial Disbursements and Fraternal Financial Disbursements (from the Financial D17). **Nancy Madson, District Six Secretary**

INDIVIDUAL LODGE CONVENTION DELEGATES' QUALIFICATIONS

Paragraph 12 of District Six Bylaws:

"Every lodge within the district shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, based of the last semi-annual report prior to the election. All members in good standing, with at least three months membership in a lodge, are eligible as delegates. In lodges not in existence for three months at the time of election, all members are eligible, regardless of length of membership."

To Illustrate:

Up to 25 members 2 delegates 26 – 75 members 3 delegates 76 – 125 members 4 delegates 126 – 175 members 5 delegates



Etc.

The 2023 year-end membership numbers will be used to determine the number of delegates to the 2024 District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. Early in 2024 a letter will be sent to each lodge indicating the number of allowed delegates from the lodge. If the current lodge membership is at or close to the upper number in a range (see above), you might want to increase your recruiting efforts to obtain another delegate.

Delegate responsibility extends beyond the actual meeting dates in June. The delegates remain District Six Lodge members for a biennium (2024 – 2026). These delegates (District Lodge members) may be called upon to vote (web-based voting) on a referendum during the next biennium.

The District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention will be held at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas from Friday, June 21 through Sunday, June 23, 2024. Board and committees meet on Thursday, June 20. The newly elected board will meet with the outgoing board members Monday morning, June 24.—*Nancy Madson, District Six Secretary*

It was a very important position. He would have been called a "Skald."* The Prose Eddas about the Nordic gods and their story of creation are an example of this. The many Scandinavian Sagas are another example. If you want to learn more about it, sign up for the class at Camp Oldfjell this year — Craig Dill.

- 3. Hardanger embroidery
- 4. Klostersom, diamantsom, other traditional needlework w/ Norwegian theme
- 5. Hand knitting w/Norwegian design
- 6. Crocheting and tatting
- 7. Figure carving w/Norwegian motif
- 8. Relief carving w/Norwegian motif
- 9. Chip carving
- 10. Bentwood/tine box or other woodworking w/Norwegian motif
- 11. Other media w/Norwegian theme: photography, painting, felting, or kolrosing

12. Viking

Included this year is a new category of anything Viking. Use your vision to create a fun entry. This category could be a combination of 'Viking' and one of the above categories – knit a Viking silhouette into a Norwegian sweater, carve a Viking ship, stitch Odin onto a quilt, etc.

13. Digital/Virtual Cultural Program

We will again have a Virtual Cultural Program category following a successful initial program at the 2022 Convention. This could be a PowerPoint or video program of Norwegian, Scandinavian, or Viking interest. This category favorite will receive the coveted 'Olaf' award.


NEW TO DISTRICT SIX WEBSITE...

Front pages from 1927 original edition in English used by Editor's mother when she attended St. Olaf College in the early '30s. Rolvaag was a St. Olaf professor originally from Dønna Municipality, Norway. He was a Norwegian—American novelist and professor who became well-known for his writings regarding the Norwegian American experience.

Some recent Scandinavian books to check out (All have been translated into English).

My Men, by Victoria Kielland (Norwegian). Norwegian immigrant woman collects husbands in rural Midwest United States, and then-...

The Woman Inside, by M.T. Edvardsson (Swedish). Ordinary people become enmeshed in a web of dire consequences.

CONVENTION COSTS EXPLAINED

Many of you might be wondering about the costs to attend the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. At my first couple of conventions, I was appalled at the cost of a lunch as a separate line-item choice — \$25-\$35 for lunch (a number of years ago!). Are you kidding! So, I skipped the group convention lunch and went to the hotel restaurant for a \$5 cup of soup. Smart, eh? Not so much. Not only did I miss out on fellowship during lunch, but in-effect, I was cheating the convention committee/host lodge. We no longer offer separate meal items for just that reason.

The price of the delegate package has to cov-

er food & beverage and numerous hotel and meeting costs. For the convention,

we use one space for the meeting; another space for the meals; another for the Folk Art Exhibition; other rooms for the cultural sessions; and another room for cookies, decorations, and supply storage. We utilize hotel 'classroom' tables for the meeting. Other tables and linens are for vendors, registration, Folk Art displays, raffle displays, and the Century Club/Recreation Center. We utilize hotel staff for room set-up, water service, cleaning,

and coffee service. Don't get me started on

Starbucks is expensive – ha, order coffee ser-

vice for a hotel convention. I'm a little peeved

as a I don't drink coffee. Thank-you, more for

the cost of hotel coffee service. You think

Audio Visual is probably the next highest cost after the actual cost of food & beverage. That AV equipment and expertise is not inexpen-



sive. Except in 2012, Bob Dahl, then Zone 7 Director from Sola Lodge in Yuma, AZ purchased a \$500 piece of equipment and did the AV himself. Technology has changed since then, and more is expected of an AV compa-

ny. Think thousands.

Then we have our own costs, which we always try to keep to a mini-

mum. Printing and mailing of the Biennial Report Book is considerable, but the cost is to the district, not to the convention committee. We also have decorations, voting paddles, awards/ribbons, signage, name badges, and delegate gifts – some of which are partially or fully donated. We try to be frugal in all we do.

Another tidbit – Convention Services charges a service charge and tax on <u>everything</u>. So, for example, a 23% service charge and an 8.375% tax – you'd expect to be 31.375% overall. Not so. The service charge is applied first, then the tax is over that. For a \$100 item, you end up paying \$133.30 for an effective upcharge of 33.3%. Not a big difference, percentagewise, but it sure adds up when the dollar amounts of services are higher – for the two included lunches, Friday Dinner, and the Sun-

We try to do a good job of keeping prices low for our delegates and guests. The 2024 negotiated room rates are a good value nowadays. (Be sure to book your room with our on-line link or group code for phone reservations.) We know you will enjoy the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino; it's a lovely hotel with great suite rooms.

The delegate package is \$325 (\$275 if received and paid by April 15); guest package is

\$250. Room costs at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino are \$79 for Thursday and Sunday nights and \$179 for Friday and Saturday nights - plus 13.38% occupancy tax – roughly \$146.26 per night average if attending four nights. The \$79/weekday rate applies to pre/post reservations based on availability.

Even more important – do you need to take money out? The form is there.

Want to know what your lodge liability is when "Gerda" scalds herself in your lodge kitchen – see the Lodge Liability Coverage Q&A form.

Is your landlord bugging you for a new Certificate of Insurance? The certificate procedure is available in Forms.

Do you need an "Additional Insured" Form for that event you are having at the Augusta National Country Club instead of at your lodge facility? Yes, there is a form to secure that and hopefully quickly.

All of these *forms* have been *formed* within the *forms* department within the long-ago *formed* Sons of Norway. Give them a *formal* Bravo-Zulu.


