### ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT CONVENTION INFORMATION

From the District Six Bylaws, Article V, paragraph 12: Every lodge within the district shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, based on the last semi-annual (membership) report prior to the election.

<u>Sunday</u>, June 23– District Lodge Meeting, Recreation Center Meeting, Folk Art Exhibition, evening President's Reception, Installation of New Officers, Banquet and Awards

<u>Monday</u>, June 24 – morning meeting of the newly elected District Board of Directors, including outgoing board

Delegates are required to be in attendance for the entire Saturday and Sunday District Lodge Meeting sessions. Come early for the fun Viking Cultural Sessions on Friday and the Viking style dinner and Viking Costume fashion show. Remember, any lodge member may attend as a guest. Check out the Convention website often as information is added periodically - 2024.sofn6.org

Costs are a key concern for delegates and lodges. Now might be the time to start a discussion about special fundraising to assist in sending delegates to the Convention. The delegate package is \$325 (\$275 if received and paid by April 15); guest package is \$285. Room costs at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino are \$79 for Thursday and Sunday nights and \$179 for Friday and Saturday nights plus 13.38% occupancy tax, roughly \$146.26 per night average if attending four nights. The hotel rooms are large suites; sharing is encouraged. The \$79/night rate applies to pre/post reservations based on availability. Assistance with finding a roommate will be available – note such request on your online registration. Use the Sons of Norway hotel reservation code or link when it becomes available. The \$39/day resort fee is waived for our group with this code or link.



Attending a District Convention is fun and educational: you learn more about Sons of Norway; you are updated and informed about the state of District Six; you meet folks from other lodges; you gain insight from cultural sessions and leadership sessions; you help chart the course of our organization; and of course, you enjoy seeing wonderful entries in the Folk-Art Exhibition and the electronic program submissions. Delegates come back enthused with new ideas to help lodges grow and thrive. The convention includes more heritage and culture, but be assured, there's business to attend to as well. This convention will be full of fun, heritage, and culture as well as the business of our future. We hope to see you there.

### **INTRIGUING CONVENTION EVENT:**

The Real Valkyrie: The Hidden History of Viking Warrior Women Speaker Nancy Marie Brown at the District Six Convention

The 2024 District Six Convention will offer a Culture and Heritage Day. Nancy Marie Brown will present a webinar at the convention on one of her latest books, *The Real Valkyrie: The Hidden History of Viking Warrior Women*.

This book is based on archeology of the Birka grave Bj581, which was originally thought to be a male warrior grave. However in 2017, DNA revealed that this Viking warrior of high status was actually a woman.



The author uses science, history, and sagas to weave a story of who this Viking woman might have been and what her story could have been. Brown challenges the reader to think of women during Viking times based on the history and the evidence in the science versus nineteenth-century Victorian biases. Brown quotes in her acknowledgements, Ulrich Raulff in *Farewell to the Horse* (Liveright, 2018), "History is written in the indicative mood, but lived and remembered in the optative—the grammatical mood of wishful thinking. That is why historical myths are so tenacious.

It's as though the truth, even when it's there for everyone to see, is powerless—it can't lay a finger on the all-powerful myth." *The Real Valkyrie* is my attempt to lay a powerful myth to rest: The myth that Viking women stayed at home, keys on their belts, while Viking men, carrying swords, raided, and traded from North American to Byzantium, Baghdad and beyond.

Anyone may attend the convention Culture and Heritage Day, and even if you aren't a delegate, you may attend the District Six Lodge meeting as a guest. On Friday June 21, 2024, there will be the webinar by Nancy Marie Brown, author of *The Real Valkyrie*; history of the Vikings by Jaan Calderon; experts on Viking textiles and clothing; Norwegian architecture; the Sons of Norway Cultural Skills literature program with a Viking focus; and more. Consider attending these special events. There will be a nominal fee for the Culture and Heritage Day attendees.

### **CONVENTION COSTS EXPLAINED**

Many of you might be wondering about the costs to attend the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. At my first couple of conventions, I was appalled at the cost of a lunch as a separate line-item choice — \$25-\$35 for lunch (a number of years ago!). Are you kidding! So, I skipped the group convention lunch and went to the hotel restaurant for a \$5 cup of soup. Smart, eh? Not so much. Not only did I miss out on fellowship during lunch, but in-effect, I was cheating the convention committee/host lodge. We no longer offer separate meal items for just that reason.

The price of the delegate package has to cov-

er food & beverage and numerous hotel and meeting costs. For the convention,

we use one space for the meeting; another space for the meals; another for the Folk Art Exhibition; other rooms for the cultural sessions; and another room for cookies, decorations, and supply storage. We utilize hotel 'classroom' tables for the meeting. Other tables and linens are for vendors, registration, Folk Art displays, raffle displays, and the Century Club/Recreation Center. We utilize hotel staff for room set-up, water service, cleaning, and coffee service. Don't get me started on the cost of hotel coffee service. You think Starbucks is expensive – ha, order coffee service for a hotel convention. I'm a little peeved as a I don't drink coffee. Thank-you, more for you all. <u>••</u>

Audio Visual is probably the next highest cost after the actual cost of food & beverage. That AV equipment and expertise is not inexpen-



sive. Except in 2012, Bob Dahl, then Zone 7 Director from Sola Lodge in Yuma, AZ purchased a \$500 piece of equipment and did the AV himself. Technology has changed since then, and more is expected of an AV compa-

ny. Think thousands.

Then we have our own costs, which we always try to keep to a mini-

mum. Printing and mailing of the Biennial Report Book is considerable, but the cost is to the district, not to the convention committee. We also have decorations, voting paddles, awards/ribbons, signage, name badges, and delegate gifts – some of which are partially or fully donated. We try to be frugal in all we do.

Another tidbit – Convention Services charges a service charge and tax on <u>everything</u>. So, for example, a 23% service charge and an 8.375% tax – you'd expect to be 31.375% overall. Not so. The service charge is applied first, then the tax is over that. For a \$100 item, you end up paying \$133.30 for an effective upcharge of 33.3%. Not a big difference, percentagewise, but it sure adds up when the dollar amounts of services are higher – for the two included lunches, Friday Dinner, and the Sun-

tion list. Click on the link, scroll down, then subscribe using the blue subscribe button on the right-hand side corresponding with your lodge officer position.

Bring this to the attention of your lodge members as they might want to subscribe to the all-district-members list if they haven't received a recent email regarding the 2024 convention.

### **BOOKING A CONVENTION ROOM TIP**

Some might try to book a convention hotel room through sites other than the convention group site. Yes, at first it might appear that rates are less expensive booking with other sites, but what is missing is the \$39.00 daily resort fee that is waived for our group. The resort fee is added after the fact to the separate bookings; it is not included in the advertised rates. I tried to book a convention hotel room choosing a low-rate site, and

with the resort fee and the 13.38% room tax, our Sons of Norway rate is still \$8.32 less per night. Also, it is very important for delegates and guests to know that without booking hotel rooms through our group, we may not qualify for the meeting rooms. That could cost us thousands of dollars.

### PHOTOS — WE ALWAYS NEED THEM

If you are a lodge officer such as President, Vice President, Cultural Officer, Public Relations Officer, Editor, or whomever your President designates, please remember to submit photos to the editor <a href="mailto:rosen@winfirst.com">rosen@winfirst.com</a>, (me) for possible use in the Viking Magazine "Happenings" section or the online "Happenings Extra" section on the Headquarters' website. (We submit almost all documented photos that we receive, but Headquarters ultimately decides



where to use photos, or whether to use them at all. Also we occasionally use some in this District Six newsletter.)

With any such photo submission we need certain data. There is a form for this on the Head-quarters' website, but if the submitter just gives me the following, I can work with it:

Name, phone and email of the submitter

Lodge name with lodge number, and location

Name of photo file and resolution or size in kb or gb

Event information – purpose, location, date of event, etc.

Suggested photo caption (preferably not more than two lines)

Do not edit the photo.

If there are minors in the photo, please confirm with a parent that it is ok to use the photo and their names.

I am still getting photos with little or no information and I don't always have time to chase down the needed data, which is a shame. – Editor.

### SUBMITTING A RESOLUTION TO THE DISTRICT LODGE MEETING

Any lodge may submit a resolution for consideration for the District Lodge Meeting that has been approved at a lodge meeting and signed by the lodge president and secretary. Any resolution suggesting a new program or cost must identify the source of funding. All resolutions must be received by the district secretary no later than March 15<sup>th</sup> of the convention year. - *Nancy Madson, District Secretary, 760-238-8819,* norsknm@gmail.com.

### **ELECTION OF CONVENTION DELEGATES**

Every lodge within the district shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, based on the last semi-annual report prior to the election. All members in good standing, with at least three months membership in a lodge, are eligible as delegates. In lodges not in existence for three months at the time of election, all members are eligible, regardless of length of membership.

### Paragraph 12 of District Six bylaws:

Up to 25 members2 delegates26 - 75 members3 delegates76 - 125 members4 delegates126 - 175 members5 delegates

Etc.

The 2023 year-end membership numbers are used to determine the number of delegates to the 2024 District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. A letter was sent to each lodge indicating the number of allowed delegates from the lodge.

Delegate responsibility extends beyond the actual meeting dates in June. The delegates remain District Six Lodge members for a biennium (2024 - 2026). These delegates (District Lodge members) may be called upon to vote (web-based voting) on a referendum during the next biennium.

The District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention will be held at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas from Friday, June 21 through Sunday, June 23, 2024. Board and committees meet on Thursday, June 20. The newly elected board will meet with the outgoing board members Monday morning, June 24.

### 2024 FOLK ART EXHIBITION GUIDELINES

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Any Sons of Norway member of District Six is eligible to enter the Folk Art Exhibition to be held during the District Lodge Meeting and Convention.

- I. Entries must fall into one of the following categories:
  - 1) Rosemaling
  - 2) Weaving w/Norwegian design
  - 3) Hardanger Embroidery
  - 4) Klostersøm, Klokkestreng, and other traditional needlework w/Norwegian theme
  - 5) Hand Knitting w/Norwegian design
  - 6) Crocheting and Tatting
  - 7) Figure Carving w/Norwegian motif, including spoon carving
  - 8) Acanthus Carving or Relief carving w/Norwegian motif
  - 9) Chip Carving
  - 10) Bentwood/Tine Box or other woodworking w/Norwegian motif
  - 11) Other Media w/Norwegian theme including photography, painting, felting, kolrosing, etc.
  - 12) Viking
  - 13) Digital/Virtual Cultural Program
- II. There are three classes within each category of exhibition.
  - 1) Youth up to age 18.
  - 2) Adult Amateurs persons who engage in the activity as a pastime or hobby only.
  - Adult Professionals –persons who engage in the activity for gainful reasons, i.e. instruction or sales.
- III. All items submitted must have been made by the entrant and must have been finished within the past two years.
- IV. An entrant is allowed to enter a maximum of two items in each category. Fill out and attach one identification label to each item.
- V. All items must be delivered to the Convention Folk Art Committee during the opening of the convention. Since the entrants may not attend the convention, delegates from the lodges may bring the entries of fellow lodge artists to the convention. Each item must have an identification label as provided in this packet.
- VI. It is very important that all entries be registered in advance. The Convention Folk Art Committee needs to know types and quantities of items in advance in order to properly plan the exhibit and prepare the certificates of participation.
- VII. The Convention Folk Art Committee retains the right to disqualify items which are soiled, stained, damaged or inappropriate in any way.

#### **SALES**

All entries should be checked either for sale or not for sale. If item is for sale, indicate the price on the entry form and on the label.

### **RETURN OF ITEMS**

Items not picked up by the owner or designated person by the specified time at the convention will be returned COD surface rate.

### **AWARDS AND CERTIFICATES**

All entrants will receive a Tusen Takk certificate. A People's Choice ribbon(s) will be awarded based on viewers' votes. The Youth Class will have a separate People's Choice ribbon(s).

### VIKING LITERATURE CLASS AT CONVENTION

**Luella Grangaard** will be presenting a Level One Literature Class at the convention. Completion of the class will qualify a participant for a Level One Reading Pin through the Sons of Norway Cultural Skills Program.



Prior to the convention, participants must read three books by Nor-

wegian or Norwegian North American authors from the Viking list on the convention website at https://2024.sofn6.org/viking-literature/.

Also prior to the class, they must complete one Reader Response Form and write a review of one of the read books for your lodge newsletter and forward the review prior to the class. Send these item to Luella at <a href="mailto:morongo2@Verizon.net">morongo2@Verizon.net</a> and be prepared to discuss the book you reviewed for your lodge newsletter.

Finally, attend the class at the convention.

### **CONVENTION DELEGATES MAY NEED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

It's time again to consider the election of delegates to the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. In fact, many lodges elect their delegates at their March meetings. Potential delegates and lodge leaders might want to consider some of these ideas for fundraising to assist with sending delegates to Las Vegas in June of 2024.

### **Activity by Delegates to raise funds:**

- \*Donate items for a raffle basket craft items, heir-loom/cultural items, baked goods, etc.
- \*Bake sale by delegates
- \*Lodge lunch or dinner put on by delegates
- \*Silent auction of services or goods provided by delegates lefse upon request, cake made for special occasion, prepare a meal, "taxi" service to & from event, donation of other business or personal service
- \*Work-a-thon by delegates where others pay/donate to have delegate do the donor's usual job

### Activity by Lodge to raise funds to assist delegates:

- \*50/50 raffle at one or more meetings
- \*Bake sale by all, to assist delegates
- \*Group yard sale
- \*Lodge lunch or dinner put on by usual workers with a portion or all profit going to assist delegates
- \*Collect cash-refund recyclables for several months
- \*Organize a group outing, getting a group discount, but charge full amount difference for delegate fund
- \*Engage a Cultural Skills group (Hardanger, Knitting, etc.) to make small items to sell Many lodges do want to help their delegates financially and no doubt there are many other ways to accomplish this.—Nancy Madson.







### Help build the "Hygge Hus" at Camp Norge!

The Recreation Center Board is excited to announce the launch of our 2024 fundraising campaign to build the "Hygge Hus" (Cozy House) cottage adjacent to Heritage Hall at Camp Norge. This duplex unit will consist of two apartments, each featuring a bedroom, bathroom, kitchen, and a front room for hanging out. Importantly, these fully accessible units will ensure inclusivity for individuals using wheelchairs and walkers.

For decades, we've shared the heartache of our aging and disabled guests who, due to terrain and room limitations, are unable to join us at Camp. We want to turn that around.

### But we need your help!

Our vision includes constructing the **Hygge Hus** in the parking area behind Heritage Hall, connected by a level, paved walkway, so our older or disabled guests can join the fun.

### One in a series of life insurance articles

### DO YOU NEED LIFE INSURANCE AFTER YOU RETIRE?

'It depends' is the simple answer. Assuming your estate is sufficient to not create a hardship or burden to your survivors, you may not need to keep an existing life insurance policy. On the other hand, if you had a child late in life or have a relative with special needs who is dependent on you for income, it makes sense to keep paying the premiums on your policy.

You also need to make sure your spouse's retirement income will not take a significant penalty when you die. Your spouse may lose your pension or annuity payments along with your social security income. If you find that your spouse will lose a significant portion of income upon your death, you may want to keep the life insurance policy to help make up the difference.

If you still have a mortgage or other large debts, you should probably keep your policy. But if your debt payments are a small part of your net worth that poses no risk of financial difficulty, then you may not need your life insurance policy.

Life insurance can also be a handy estateplanning tool as explained in a previous District Six Newsletter. If you own a business that you want to keep in the family and you don't have enough liquid assets to take care of the estate taxes or the heirs not receiving part of the business, a life insurance policy can help pay taxes and/or keep the inheritance equitable.

On January 16, 1895, 18 immigrants from Norway met to formally establish Sons of Norway. The purpose of this group was to set up financial protection for themselves and their families in situations of sickness or death. One could say this would be a very early version of a life insurance group.

Certain life insurance policies can be 'cashed in' for the surrender value if those funds are needed now or if the policy would not be needed by your survivors. Also, there are third-party companies that will 'buy' your policy in a 'life settlement' transaction.

If your finances, without your life insurance policy, will not create a hardship or burden on your survivors, you may want to consider keeping the policy for charitable endeavors. There are innumerable organizations and charities that would accept being the beneficiary of a life insurance policy. But in keeping in touch with your heritage, culture, and interests, your life insurance policy could be used to fund an endowment scholarship within the Sons of Norway Foundation. Even if your life insurance policy benefits are small or shared with others, consider leaving a portion to the Sons of Norway Foundation.
